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                        EX PARTE MOTION FOR AN ORDER ALLOWING
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                        SERVICE UPON DEFENDANT BY PUBLICATION
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           The Chapter 7 Trustee, Victoria L. Nelson (the "Trustee" or "Plaintiff"), by and
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The Chapter 7 Trustee, Victoria L. Nelson (the "**Trustee**" or "**Plaintiff**"), by and through her attorneys, Schwartz Flansburg PLLC, hereby moves this Court for the entry of an order allowing service upon defendant Elsie Peladas-Brown ("**Brown**" or the "**Defendant**") by publication (the "**Motion**"). In support of the Motion, the Trustee respectfully states as follows:

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Preliminary Statement

- 1. On May 21, 2015, the Trustee filed a complaint against Brown alleging claims for breach of fiduciary duty, common law misrepresentation, negligent misrepresentation and declaratory relief, thereby commencing the above-captioned adversary proceeding.
- 2. As stated in the Complaint, Brown is believed to be a resident of the State of Nevada, but upon information and belief, Brown may have fled to the Philippines.
- 3. As set forth herein and in the Declaration of Janine Lee, attached hereto as **Exhibit A**, numerous attempts have been made to locate the current whereabouts of Brown, both in Nevada, and in the Philippines. Unfortunately, the Trustee has been unable to locate Brown. Accordingly, the Trustee asks that the Court allow service to be made on Brown by publication in the Las Vegas Review Journal, a newspaper of general circulation in Las Vegas, Nevada, the location of Brown's last known address.

Argument

4. Bankruptcy Rule 7004(c) provides as follows:

If a party to an adversary proceeding to determine or protect rights in property in the custody of the court cannot be served as provided in Rule 4(e)-(j) F.R.Civ.P. or subdivision (b) of this rule, the court may order the summons and complaint to be served by mailing copies thereof by first class mail, postage prepaid, to the party's last known address, and by at least one publication in such manner and form as the court may direct.

Fed. R. Bankr. P. 7004(c).

5. Moreover, Rule 4(e)(1) of the Federal Rules of Civil Procedure, in turn, provides that "service of an individual . . . may be effected in any judicial district of the United States pursuant to the law of the state in which the district court is located. . . ." Rule 4(e)(1) of the Nevada Rules of Civil Procedure permits service by publication where the court determines that upon affidavit that the person upon whom service is to be made resides out of the state; has

departed from the state; has, by concealment, sought to avoid service, or otherwise, after due diligence, cannot be found. Nev. R. Civ. P. 4(e)(1).

- 6. In this matter, the Trustee, through her counsel, exercised due diligence in their efforts to locate and personally serve Brown, but those efforts proved fruitless. There is no reason to believe that further efforts will meet different results, and will like require significant costs and expenses to the Trustee.
- 7. Specifically, as set forth in the Lee Declaration attached hereto as **Exhibit A**, the Trustee's counsel has done the following, as set forth in the timeline below:
 - 5/21/2015 inquire with Ryan Works, Esq., counsel for Ameri-Dream Realty, LLC, and counsel for Brown's ex-husband, regarding Brown's whereabouts;
 - 5/26/2015 inquire with Lance Maningo, Esq., Brown's attorney who represented her in her divorce;
 - 5/27/2015 mail copy of summons and complaint to Brown at her last known address in Las Vegas, Nevada;
 - 5/29/2015 inquire with Alex Villanueva, Esq, an attorney in Manila, Philippines, regarding location and possible service of defendant in the Philippines; and
 - 6/12/2015 e-mail copy of summons and complaint to Brown at her last known e-mail address, which e-mail was not returned as undeliverable.
- 8. Moreover, the Trustee's counsel is in the process of obtaining pricing for the services of a private investigator in the Philippines, but as the Trustee and her counsel are not positive Brown is in the Philippines (she could be residing in Nevada), the Trustee submits that service by publication will be the most efficient and cost effective manner of serving Brown with the summons and complaint.

1	9. Accordingly, the Trustee submits that service by publication in the Las Vegas
2	Review Journal is necessary and appropriate, and requests that the Court enter an order granting
3	the same.
5	WHEREFORE, the Trustee respectfully requests that the Court enter an order: (i)
6 7	allowing service of Brown by publication; and (ii) granting such other relief this Court deems
8	necessary and appropriate.
